Required J-1 Health Insurance	The U.S. Department of State mandates that each International Exchange		
	Visitor and all dependents on a J-Visa will carry Health Insurance for the		
	length of their visit, and must cover the following regulations:		
	1. Medical Insurance must cover the entire period of participation in the		
	Institution.		
	2. Medical benefits must provide a minimum of \$100,000 per accident or		
	illness.		
	3. Medical evacuation must be covered in the amount of \$50,000		
	minimum.		
	4. Repatriation must be covered in the amount of \$25,000 minimum.		
	5. Deductibles must not exceed \$500 per accident or illness.		
	International J-1 Exchange Students will NOT be able to start at Rowan		
	University or register if they are not able to show proof of purchase of a J-1		
	Health Insurance that covers the points mentioned above.
