



APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The required application documents:

a) A completed inbound application form with a passport size photo

b) A letter of recommendation from Head of Department / Dean from Home Institution stating purpose and duration of study at UTAR

c) A copy of Official Academic Transcripts (in certified English translation if the original language is not English)

d) A copy of passport (only pages with passport number, photo, issuance and expiry date)


The following additional documents are required for Student pass and Visa Application: a) A copy of passport size photo with size 4.5 cm x 3.5 cm (white background) – JPEG format b) A letter of confirmation from Home Institution to prove that applicant is enrolled as a full-time student at Home Institution

c) A copy of passport for all pages including blank pages (The passport must be valid for at least 12 months from the expected date of entry)

d) Health Declaration form

Passport Photo Guidelines

1. In colour and identical, not black and white

2. Taken against a WHITE background

3. Your photos must be **professionally printed** and **45 millimetres (mm) high x 35mm wide. Please do not use photos that have been cut down from larger pictures.** In the examples below, the one on the *left shows the correct proportions*. The image on the right shows incorrect proportions.





LANGKAWI



Langkawi is a serene archipelago of 140 islands – only a few of which are inhabited. The largest of these is the eponymous Langkawi Island, which has UNESCO World Geopark status because of its richly populated (by wildlife, that is) conservation areas. The best way to experience these ecological wonders is from high above, on the Langkawi Sky Bridge that stretches above the rainforest. Cheekily-named Pregnant Maiden freshwater lake is a great place to take a dip or play keep-away with the kleptomaniac monkeys.





Nicknamed the Pearl of the Orient, Penang is famous for its soft sandy beaches and is fondly regarded as the food capital of Malaysia. Some of the most interesting sites of Penang include the sandy beaches of Tanjung Bungah, the landscape from the summit of Penang Hill and the vipers in the Snake Temple. The quaint nooks and crannies of Georgetown and the Tropical Spice Garden – the only spice garden in South East Asia – as well as Penang's many flea markets, pasar malams', KOMTAR and modern shopping malls also merit a visit.
