**1.Qualification:** Students enrolled at UOU's partner university in Japan and interested in Korean language and Korean culture

- 3. Documents submission deadline: May 27(Mon) 2024 ~ May 31 (Fri)
  - \* Please email the list of applicants if you cannot submit the documents before the deadline.
- 4. Program period: August 5(Mon) 2024 ~ August 23(Fri) 2024
- 5. Program Fee: 1,530,000 KRW (30,000 KRW for health insurance included)
  - \*Applicants who have proper insurance such as traveler's insurance from Japan, may choose not to pay for UOU insurance. (Cost of training without insurance fee: 1,500,000won)
  - \* Program fee must be paid no later than June 21(Fri) 2024.
  - \* If the number of participant is small, the cost will increase.

### 8. Details of program

# 1) Korean Language class

- Korean lesson 1~13 (Each lesson 3hours)
- 6 levels of classes (Level 1 ~ Level 6) are offered depending the student's proficiency.
- Students will take a placement test to be enrolled at a proper class level.

# 2) Korean Culture Lesson (Connected with Korean Language class)

- Making pottery: Making it by himself in Craft village
- Field tip to Gyeongju city: A tour of various cultural properties
- Taekwondo: Korean national martial art
- Traditional cultures: Hanbok, Hanji Craft and Samulnori
- Traditional games: Yutnori and Jegichagi
- Cooking Korean food
- Ulsan City tour: Tours of industries and tourist attractions representing Ulsan (Hyundai Motor Company, Daewangam Park, etc.)

# General information for 2024 UOU SKLCP

#### 1. Arrival and Return

- Arrival date: August 3(Sat) 2024 ~ August 4(Sun) 2024

- Return date: August 24(Sat) 2024

# 2. Pick-up

- Pick-up service is offered during arrival date.
- Pick-up Place: Gimhae(Busan)Airport, Busan Port International Passenger Terminal, KTX station.

# 3. Dormitory

- On campus dormitory is offered.
- Room type is 2-people room. (including cooling facilities, toilets and bathrooms)

#### 4. Meal

- Breakfast (lunch box provided every morning)
- Lunch or dinner is on your own

# 5. Visa

- Japanese: No visa required (You can stay in Korea without a visa for up to 90 days)
- -Other nationality: Check out if visa is exempted or not. If necessary, ask for assistance.

# FAQ on Living for 2024 UOU SKLCP

- Q) How much does laundry cost?
- A) In the dormitory laundry cost is free.
- Q) Do I need to exchange money?
- A) From the day you enter Korea, you need Korean currency for meals and shopping, so bring cash in KRW. Students who want to exchange money in Ulsan can visit the campus bank with the staff during the program. For your information, you can pay by a credit card in most of places, Korea.
- Q) How much does it cost to live for three weeks?
- A) There are individual differences. Breakfast is served for three weeks, but lunch and dinner are at your own expenses. The meals at restaurants near campus are about 10,000 KRW.
- Q) Can I use Wifi in the dormitory?
- A) You can access Wi-Fi through the school wireless Internet, but depending on the distance from the router, there are rooms where Wi-Fi is not connected well.
- Q) Does UOU offer pillows and bedding?
- A) It's ready in the dormitory. Bring your own bedding if you want to use it.

But please bring the hair dryer from Japan.

- Q) Is the distance between the dormitory and the classroom far?
- A) You will stay in the on-campus dormitory. The classroom is close to the dormitory.
- Q) How about insurance?
- A) Students are advised to sign up for UOU medical insurance. However, if you buy an insurance in Japan, you don't have to buy UOU medical insurance. If you do not have the UOU insurance, you will pay the hospital fee in Korea and claim the insurance fee from the insurance company after returning to Japan.
- Q) What clothes do I need?
- A) Sneakers: Taekwondo class, Sport Center gym etc Long-sleeved top: Please bring it with you because the air conditioner in the room is strong.
- Q) Can I stay in the dormitory personally after the program?
- A) Students for Fall semester will move in right after SKLCP, you have to move out on the returning date.
