Additional requirements for Master students: <i>copy of Bachelor or Diploma certificate</i> D. Language Skills Students are not required to send language certificates for German or English. However, they have to have language skills equivalent to CEFR B2 in either language, depending on which courses the students want to take. We expect our partner universities to ensure that students fulfill these requirements. E. Health insurance Students need to have health insurance valid for the whole duration of their stay in Munich. Shortly before their arrival, they will be asked to provide proof of health insurance (either by EHIC or a private insurance). Information for all students: Travel insurance is not sufficient for studying in Germany! We cannot accept any travel insurances. We recommend to thoroughly read our Health Insurance document. G. What is the main language of instruction?	German and a variety of English taught subjects.

Are there any course restrictions for exchange students?	Exchange students can choose courses across all departments. Some courses are limited to a certain number of participants or have pre-requisites. Some courses are only open to students of the respective field (see website above). Students are advised to choose additional courses as a back-up.

Housing, costs and other pre-arrival information

Is on-campus accommodation available to exchange students?	HM has no dormitories of its own, so, there is no on-campus housing available. HM International Office will provide all exchange students with helpful information on finding accommodation in Munich. Exchange students can apply for a room in a student residence hall (=“Service Package”) run by the Studierendenwerk München (student union) in the exchange application form A. The Studierendenwerk Munich (student union) offers rooms for only 30% of all exchange students. The rental agreement will be issued for 6 months. A shorter or longer period is not possible. Accommodation in a residence hall cannot be guaranteed. Please note: Students with incomplete or late applications cannot be taken into consideration for accommodation in a residence hall of the Studierendenwerk. We are also not able to assign student accommodation to those students coming in addition to the yearly quota set by the existing bilateral agreement between HM and the respective partner university.
What is the rental period for the residence halls of the Studierendenwerk?	Winter semester: September 1st – February 28th Summer semester: March 1st – August 31st
Are students receiving assistance if they do not receive a room from the Studierendenwerk?	In July/January students will be informed whether or not they were allocated a room. The International Office provides detailed information on accommodation possibilities in Munich to those who did not receive a room with Studierendenwerk. We strongly advise students to start looking for accommodation early on in advance.
Do students have to pay a service fee?	German Universities of Applied Sciences do not charge any tuition fees. However, all students in Germany (incl. exchange students) must pay a mandatory semester contribution to the local student union. At HM the semester contribution is currently 85,00 Euro per semester (subject to change). This contribution is obligatory for all students in Munich and has been agreed upon by the student councils of all universities in Munich. HM only collects the contribution and transfers it to the respective recipients. Students will receive further information about the transfer details approx. 6 weeks after they have been accepted as an exchange student.
Estimated cost of living	We recommend around 1000-1200 € per month. Please see our website for more information: https://www.hm.edu/exchange/ > Living Costs
