International Workshop on Planning and Design for Urban and Environmental Issues (Global Project-based Learning Program) was held at International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM) in collaboration with the Department of Urban and Regional Planning, Kulliyah of Architecture and Environmental Design. The workshop was conducted by 12 IIUM and 18 SIT undergraduate (3-4th grade) students who were divided into three groups which consisted of 4 IIUM and 6 SIT students.

Kampong Bharu, a historic urban district in Kuala Lumpur was selected for the case study area. Each group conducted a field survey including attending a briefing by Kampong Bharu Development Corporation, and an interview with local people in addition to filed observation and data collection on the site. After the field survey, group discussions to identify the issues of the study area, and group work about proposals for solving the issues to refer to the cases in Japan were conducted before the final presentation. Every student in each group made a good final presentation which adequately identified the significant issues of Kampong Bharu and showed insightful planning and design proposals.

The students were also able to enhance their understandings about architectural, urban, and environmental knowledge and issues through the additional site visits to traditional Malay villages and houses, the Elephant Conservation and Rehabilitation Center, a flood-prone area along the river, a mangrove forest in Langkawi, an aquaculture farm, and so on.
